Dave Smith & Co Framing Contractor Client Achieves NO Citations After An Injury

A carpenter working for TMI Construction, a framing contractor, suffered a leg laceration injury from contact with a powered circular saw. The injury was serious, and reported to the closest office of Cal OSHA within 8 hours. An onsite inspection resulted.

After an inspection including a review of records and programs, Cal OSHA determined that there were no violations and issued a Notice of No Violation. This is particularly impressive because framing contractors are on the California 2015-16 High Hazard Industry List, where additional scrutiny is applied. https://www.dir.ca.gov/dosh/hhu_list.pdf

HOW DID THEY DO IT?

TMI has a fully implemented safety program, including an Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP), Heat Illness Prevention Program, Code of Safe Practices and all other required written programs.

Employee training is ongoing and documented.

Personal protective equipment including head protection (hard hats) and eye protection (safety glasses) is required.

All jobsites have a “Safety Station” with water, first aid supplies and required postings. This SHOWS commitment to safety.

The company really tries to implement safety at all levels of the organization.
